As informed earlier, you are being cordially invited as a resource person in a training programme for farmers at Peernagar Soodna, Hapur, Uttar Pradesh, to be conducted as a part of regular activity of the collaborative project between ICAR-IARI and IIL-foundation, New Delhi, titled "Social value system development about judicious use of Pesticides and other agro-chemicals and entrepreneurship among youth". The date has been

finalized to be 18th January, 2019. Nearly 60 farmers are expected to be present in the training. It is being organized to impart training about seed production, at present of carrot and wheat. Also, the upcoming spring-summer vegetables are being targeted. The management techniques of insect-pests and diseases of chilli, brinjal, cucurbits will be initiated in this meeting.

The farmers need to know about the vector-pathogen relationship to understand the reason behind adoption of various management techniques for crops. This will be tried as an extension technique, because, generally, they get superficial and diluted knowledge of plant protection. The understanding and retention of the knowledge will be tested later.

Apart from three experts of Seed production, Plant Pathology and Insect vector and pathogen relationship, one from Insect toxicology will also be there. The training will begin from around 11.30-12.30pm, as suggested by the farmers. Before that, field visit would take place. Vehicle will pick you up from the place of your convenience and honorarium for the expert will be given.
